

The Story of Fort Dobbs

An Invitation to Join

The only site of its kind in North Carolina, Fort Dobbs State Historic Site is located near Statesville and provides a window into the tumultuous period of history known as the French and Indian War (1754-1763). Fort Dobbs represents the state's link to what truly was a global war for empire between England and France that crossed five continents, lasted nearly a decade and sowed the seeds of independence that determined the fate of North America.



The fort was named for Arthur Dobbs, Royal Governor of the Colony of North Carolina, who ordered its construction. From 1756 until 1761, Fort Dobbs served as barracks for the North Carolina provincial soldiers, shelter for settlers during Indian attacks and supply depot for the British Empire. The fort's location defined the western frontier for the colony of North Carolina in British North America. By 1764, Fort Dobbs was abandoned following the Treaty of Paris, which officially ended the war.

In 1973, the State of North Carolina completed its acquisition of the nearly 32 acres of the fort's original site aided by the Fort Dobbs Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR), which donated ten of the acres in hopes of the fort's eventual reconstruction. Fort Dobbs was designated as a state historic site under the purview of the NC Department of Cultural Resources in 1976.

Fort Dobbs is one of only a small number of National Registered Historic Sites in the U.S. that actively interprets the French and Indian War in an authentic living history style. Of these sites, it is the last one that has yet to be reconstructed.

The Friends of Fort Dobbs is a not-for-profit organization which serves the site's mission "to preserve and interpret North Carolina's only French and Indian War fort." Without the Friends group, Fort Dobbs would not be able to offer the educational programming provided through various living history weekends, as well as off-site programming. 


